1 minute: The teacher will explain the instructions to the class.

5 minutes: Students will read their sentence strips together focusing on decoding and blending either individual letter or letter combination sounds that they are unfamiliar with alongside the sight words they do know. The group dynamic will help support gaps in learning from students who are more so at the speech emergent stage of English learning.

3 minutes:After reading their cloze sentence strips students will then find the picture with their corresponding letter. They will fill in their sentences and read the completed sentence together.

## **Materials and Technology**

- Picture cards for each of five different animals, including the word form written underneath and a corresponding letter A E, each stuck up on the wall at different places around the room.
- Printed sentence strips, one for each student 20 in total. There are 4 with each of the letters A - E on, so 4 with the letter A on and 4 with the letter B on for example.
- Pencils for each student.
